

Privacy Policy

Thank you for visiting DNAforAfrica's website. Your privacy is important to us. To better protect your privacy, we provide this notice explaining our online information practices and the choices you can make about the way your information is collected and used at this website. DNAforAfrica takes precautions to keep the information disclosed to us secure, and DNAforAfrica will not intentionally disclose such information to third parties for commercial purposes. To prevent unauthorised access, maintain data accuracy, and to ensure the appropriate use of information, we have put in place electronic safeguards, as well as, internal organisational procedures to safeguard and secure the information that you provide.

The Information We Collect

On sections of this site you can contact us. The types of personally identifiable information that may be collected at these pages include: name, address, e-mail address, telephone number and information about yourself and interest in services we may offer or provide. How We Use the Information
