


STATE OF EVENTS



- In 2021, bad publicity and inaccurate information portrayed by the media gave the Biology Section a bad name.
- The backlog at the time was over 241 000 entries across the country where EC contributed 16 045 entries.
- To alleviate such a backlog took intense planning and reshuffling of Human Resources to provide an efficient service to the citizens of the Republic and other African states.
- Appointment of FSL Component Head : Major General Mulaudzi(2021) and appointment of Section Head: Brig Hlalele(2022)


Finalization Rate: BIOLOGY

finalisation rate has increased progressively from 21.48% in Q1 2021/22; 160.75% in Q1 2022/23; 182.50% in Q2 2/2023 and in Q3 2022/2023 is at 102.43%. In Q4 2022/2023 it was at 95.44% and the total for the 2022/2023 was at




NPA/SAPS PROJECT: COURT REQUESTS

ADDITIONAL PHYSICAL RESOURCES QGEBERHA (EC)



- The laboratory has been equipped with the following for DNA analysis:
- 12 DNA Isolation work stations
- 2 Quantification work stations
- 2 Amplification work stations
- 2 Fragment Separation work stations
- Resulting in an average of ± 9000 DNA samples processed per month.





- Biology Section in the EC has appointed 22 new Forensic Analysts currently under training since 2023-01.
- 7 New interns (administration support) injected to EC since 2023-03.

• EC Laboratory has processed 4423 number of samples with 51% first time success rate (approximately 631 entries finalized)





- The impact of the EC laboratory will decrease the sample processing rate of the Western Cape Laboratory allowing the WC laboratory to give full attention to the WC and Northern Cape cases thus also providing a speedy and efficient service to the 2 provinces.
- Priority case: since the launch EC has processed independently the media case (FortHare University murder's)
