








Growing population & increasing violent crime = increasing burden on FPS




Salt River Mortuary Unidentified Case load- 2010-2020 (n= 3137)

Challenges with unidentified bodies in Metro West 📮



Average length of stay till release ≈ 427 days (124 in 2013).

FPS partnered with Victim Identification Unit (VIC) → DNA analysis & facial reconstruction
