


AFSA Mission

Forensic science is a case-based (or multi-case-based) research-oriented, science-based endeavor to study traces - the remnants of past activities (such as an individual's presence and actions) – through their detection, recognition, recovery, examination, and interpretation to understand anomalous events of public interest (e.g., crimes, security incidents).

Who creates the narrative?

- Sources of information
 - If we as scientists do not interact with media
 - They get their information elsewhere
 - THE STORY WILL BE TOLD
- Engage across sectors
 - Scientists vs media vs legal
- Work to ensure that the correct information is disseminated
 - What it takes in reality
 - Expect miscommunication
 - Expect some mis-quotes (intentional vs unintentional)
 - Media deadlines
 - Get yourself media-smart
 - Attend our AFSA webinar on this topic later this year

 - Staff: Dr Solange MUKAMURENZI








Registration as INGO in Rwanda







Putting Systems in Place

AFSA

- Formalising systems from the start
 - E.g. financial
 - Bank account after registration
 - Ecobank in Kigali, Rwanda
- Currently
 - Putting systems in place for easier payment by members
 - Annually from start of July to end of June next year
 - Full members \$50
 - Associate members \$30
 - Students \$10



To apply for membership in this category the applicant already has/are:

- Credentials in forensic science
 - A Qualification: graduate or post-graduate qualification, thus education or training in forensic science or equivalent
 - Work experience in forensic science alone (minimum 5 years)
- Works within or outside Africa, but is African
- Non-Africans but providing a verifiable forensic sciences service in Africa
- Can be an office bearer in AFSA
- Pay an annual membership fee, currently set at 50 USD
- Has a vote in AFSA, full members have 1 vote each



Associate Member

To apply for membership in this category the applicant already has/are:

- Non forensic scientists
 - Working to promote forensic science
 - E.g. legal professionals, law enforcement officers
- Forensic scientists who are not African
- Professionals who do not practice forensic science
- Non-African origin professionals practicing forensic science in a forensic institution in Africa
- Cannot be an office bearer in AFSA
- Membership fee currently set at 30 USD
- Has no vote in AFSA

To apply for membership in this category the applicant already has/are:


- African forensic science students studying in Africa or outside Africa
- Non-African students studying forensic science in Africa
- Are in training (e.g. work based and medical residency) in forensic programmes or relevant forensic science institutions in Africa.
- Pay an annual membership fee, currently set at 10 USD
- Has no vote in AFSA

This category of membership is reserved for organisations and are not open to individuals. To apply for membership in this category the applicant already is:


- An organisation located within or outside of Africa that promotes forensic sciences in Africa


